

#### Sun Yat Sen Hall Chinese American Speakers

12:45-1:15 Shawna Yang Ryan - Ms. Ryan will discuss her book, Water Ghosts, a story of Locke, 1928, and lives of the Chinese affected by the era's immigration laws, weaving history with mythology, mingling cultures and forgotten history.

**1:20-1:50** Eddie Wong, Angel Island Immigrant Station-Angel Island, known as the "Ellis Island of the West," was shaped by the Chinese Exclusion Act, the only legislation ever to ban a specific ethnic group from entry into the U.S.

**1:55 – 2:25** Felicia Lowe - Will discuss, Carved in Silence, the story of Chinese immigrants detained at Angel Island. The awarding film will be playing continuously alongside the Gateway to Gold Mountain exhibit in the Confucius Church.

**2:30-3:00** Judy Yung - Author of Island: Poetry and History of Chinese Immigrants on Angel Island. Yung will speak on Chinese American Voices during the Exclusion Era and describe Chinese American life in the shadows of Exclusion.

**3:05-3:35** Eddie Fung - Chinatown Kid, Texas Cowboy, Prisoner of War, the only Chinese American soldier captured by Japanese during WWII. Put to work building the Burma-Siam railroad made famous by the film, "The Bridge on the River Kwai," he will discuss life during Exclusion and as a cowboy that helped him endure forty-two months of captivity.

**3:40-4:00** Chung Mei Post 8358 - WWII veterans of Post 8358 fought for the rights of all Americans, but because of exclusion, they were denied those same rights. Members will be on hand to participate in a panel discussion.

#### **Children's Chinese Cultural Activities**

This year's theme is based on the traditional Chinese Moon Festival. With 30 activity booths, this is a fun and exciting way to learn Chinese language and culture.

#### **Ping Yuen China Arts Courtyard**

Come and visit the Ping Yuen Courtyard to enjoy Chinese paper folding or zhezhi, the art of paper folding that originated in China. This year we are supporting the Cranes for Peace. Every year many thousands of people around the world fold paper cranes as an expression of hope for a world at peace, where non-violent means are used to resolve conflicts, and where people can live without fear. The cranes will be taken to the Children's Monument in the Peace Park in Hiroshima. Also, enjoy creating up to three different types of Chinese lanterns in the shade of the Ping Yuen courtyard. And, there's calligraphy which led to Chinese brush painting starting around 4000 B.C. and continuing for more than 6000 years.
